Idaho Shanti Project to Begin

A Shanti-style project to support and care for people with AIDS and ARC is in the formation stages. Volunteers from MCC, TCC, IAF and both the general and gay communities will join Dr. Julie Phister in this effort.

In a phone conversation with *The Paper* Dr. Phister explained that Shanti is all about. Two types of volunteers are used for support of AIDS patients. The first will work with only one patient at a time, providing the type of support needed by a seriously ill individual. This will require training and these training sessions will be set up in two 6 hour periods, probably on consecutive weekends. The second type of volunteer will serve 1 to 4 hours a week as a sort of "gofer" for patients. This will involve making phone calls, typing, running errands, providing the love and support that can only be found in something as simple and as warm as a batch of home-baked cookies. Both types of volunteers are equally important and will be badly needed as the force of AIDS hits Idaho.

Already we have had six cases of AIDS in our state -- three of the victims have already died. NOW is the time to mobilize a trained group of volunteers so that people with AIDS in our state will have someone to stand by them during this terrible time. If you think you have what it takes to be one of the two types of volunteers listed above, please contact Dr. Phister by phone. Call 336-5100 during working hours or 336-4864 in the evenings. An application will be sent to you and arrangements made for a personal interview. Because of the serious nature of this work some screening will be necessary to make sure each volunteer understands exactly what this responsibility will entail. This job doesn't pay in money, but the richness of the reward will never be measured.
